Belgian, b. 1979

Sophie De Zutter's work is an intimate exploration of material, time, and the balance between strength and fragility. Handmade paper, clay and pigments become witnesses to a subtle dialogue between the hand, the material and the moment. She creates her own paper using traditional techniques, and each piece emerges from a slow, intuitive process in which textures and reliefs gradually unfold, revealing the richness of imperfections.

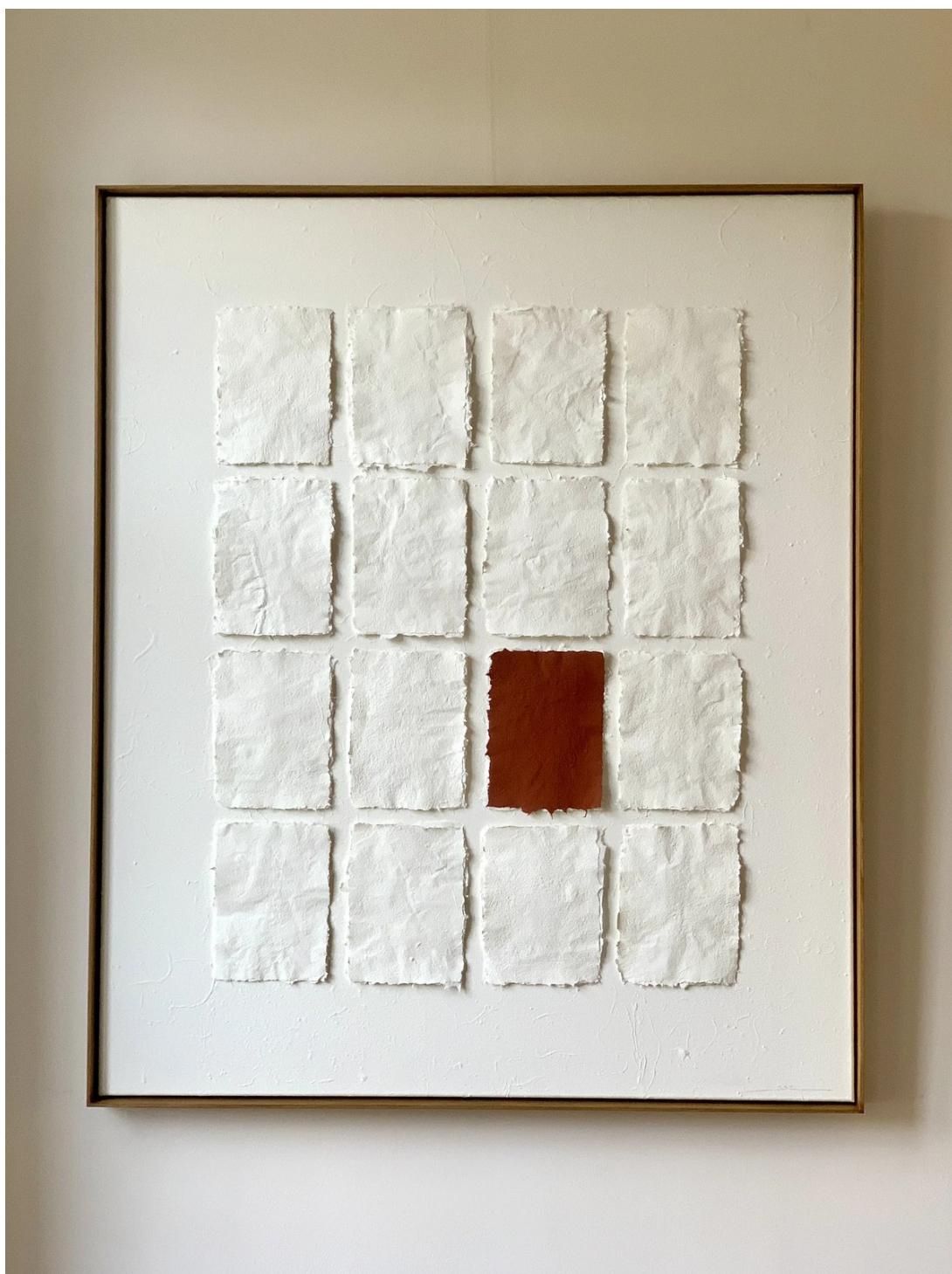

James Hawke has painted and drawn as his full-time occupation since leaving college. He studied drawing at the Ecole Supérieur des Beaux Arts, Paris (Studio Pierre Matthey), before completing his foundation at Great Yarmouth College of Art and Design and painting at Manchester Polytechnic. Since 1998 his work has been dominated by the 'Poolside' project - images of the illusory world printed on holiday brochures, drawn from the theatrical colour of Mediterranean tourist destinations and beaches across the world.

He now works from his studio in Norfolk.

Belgian, b. 1973

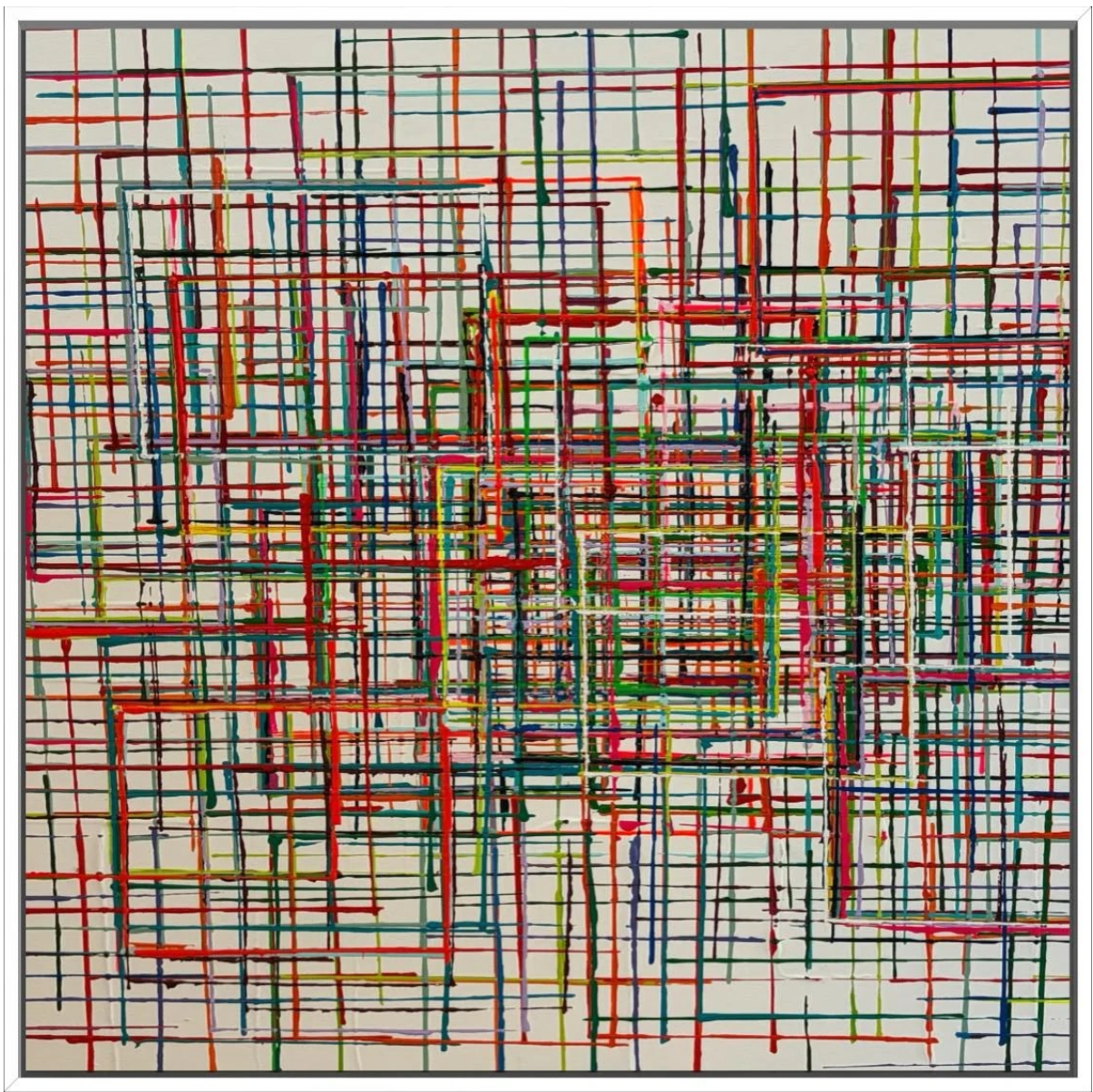
Born in Brussels in 1973, Valou Kervyn has been drawn to colour combinations, shapes and the emotions they evoke since childhood. After studying graphic design at the Ecole de Recherche Graphique (ERG) and Ecole du 75 in Brussels, she continued to refine her craft through evening illustration courses with artists such as Alain Goffin. Her paintings are an intuitive expression of emotion - colour, material and movement composed into rhythms described as 'a space of geometric freedom and superimposed emotions'.

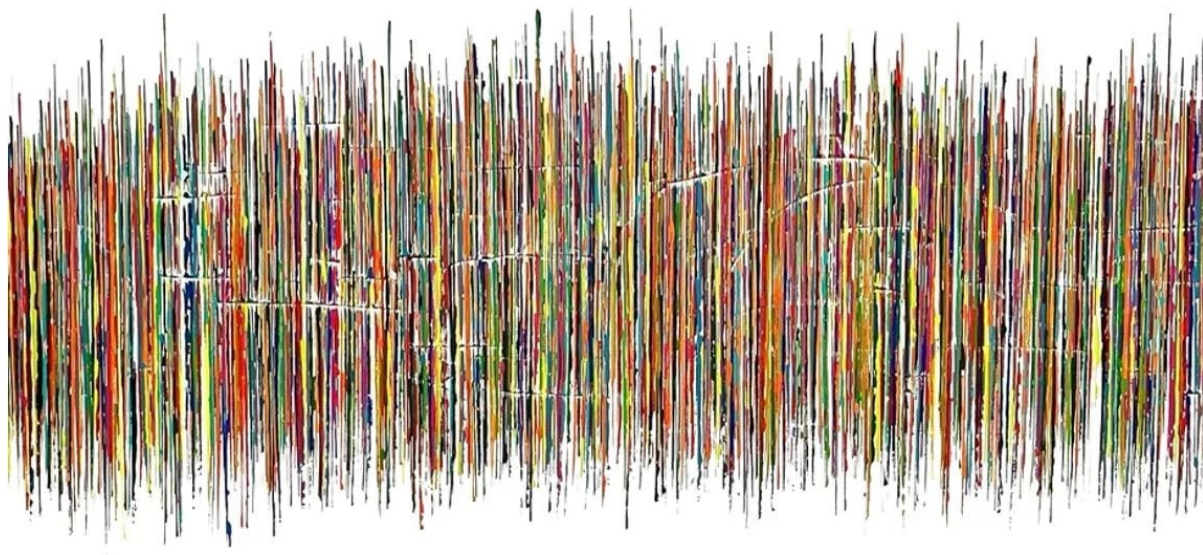

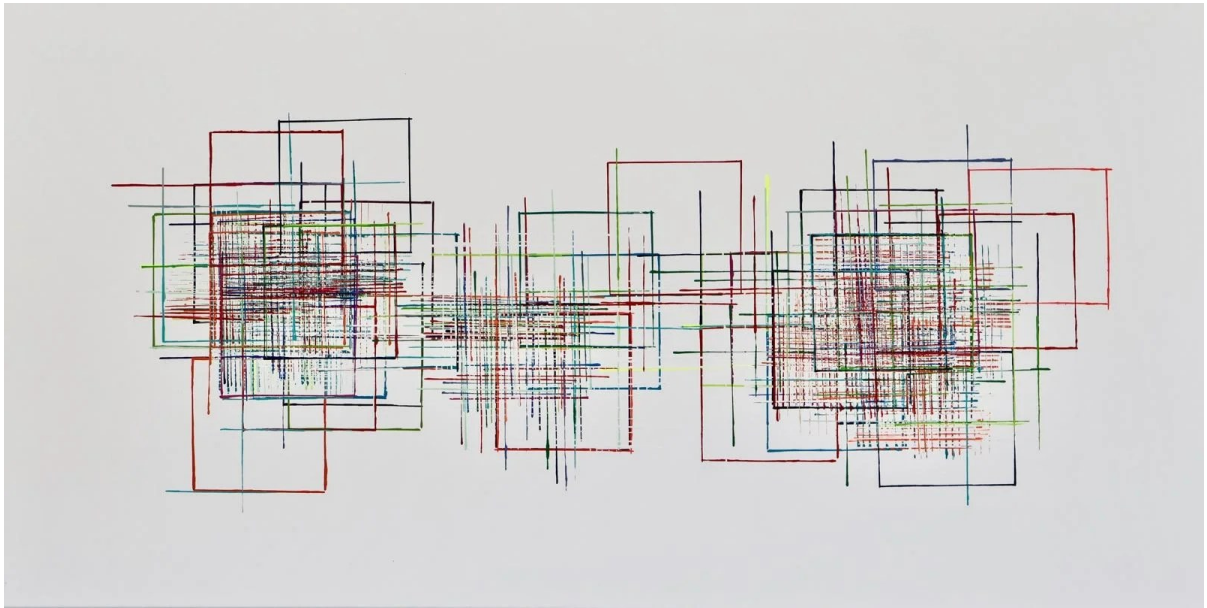

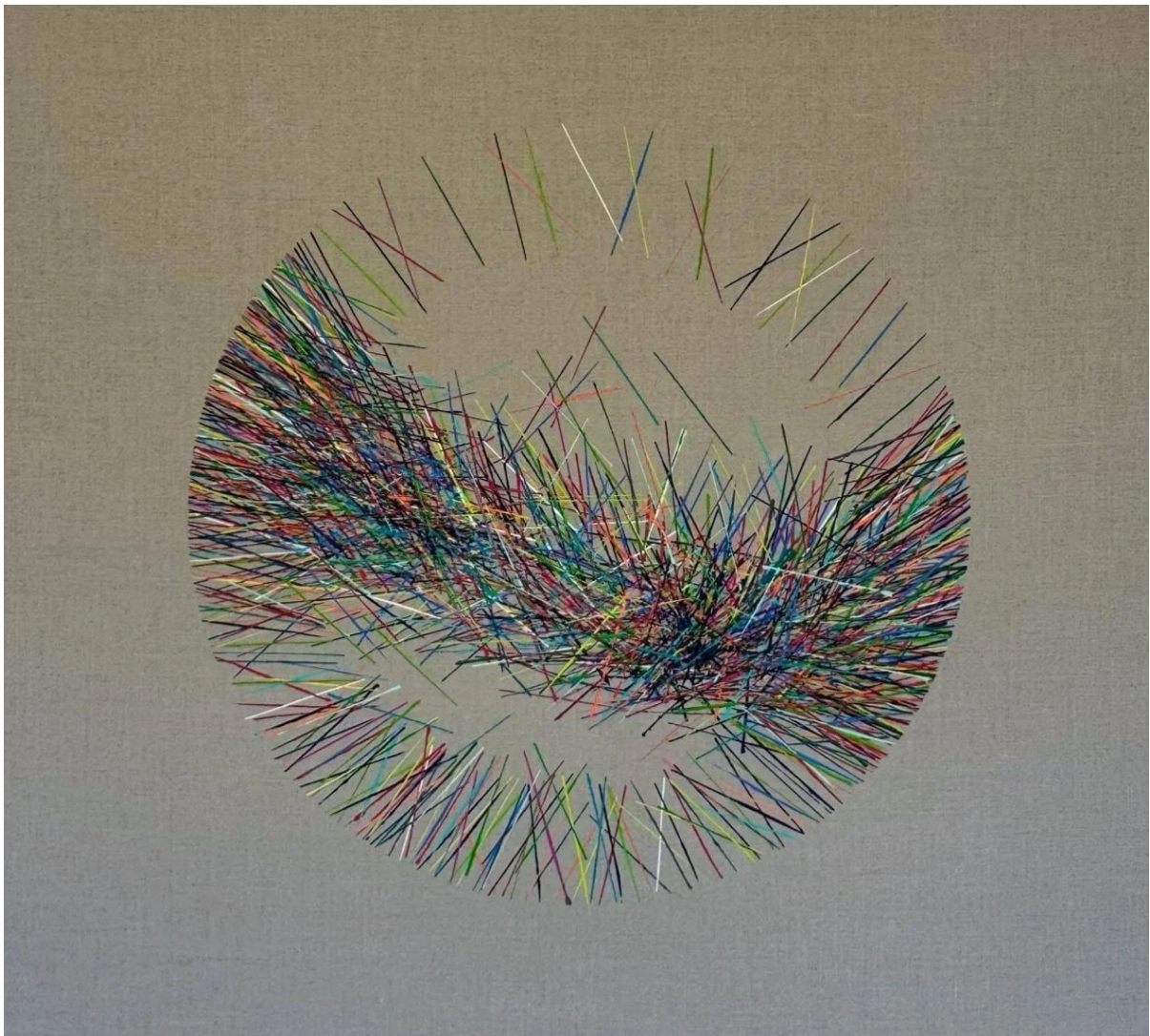

N A T A L I E P L E I S

Belgian, b. 1968

Born in Ghent in 1968, Natalie Pleis moves between Belgium and France, where she studied art history in Paris. She soon delved into the art of furniture restoration, particularly marquetry, before turning her focus to perfecting patinas - a practice in which time seemed to dance slowly. This path led her to craft paintings on wood, incorporating materials such as stone, marble, earth and even water. Her abstract works, sprinkled with an essence of illusion, evoke the sea, the break of dawn and a fiery dance. Rooted in the natural world, she works exclusively with natural or metallic pigments, applied with a palette rather than brushes, keeping the secret of her technique shrouded in mystery.

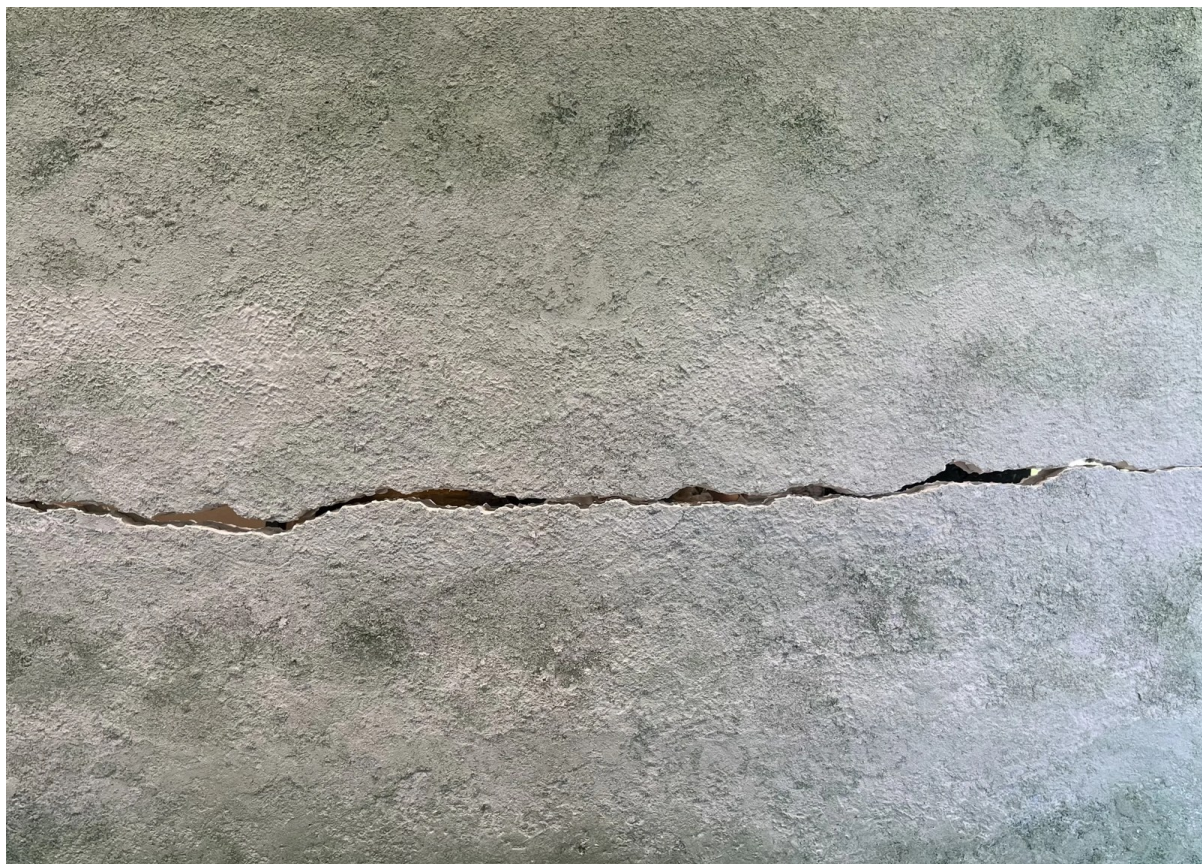

B R I A N R E I N K E R

American, b. 1960

American-born Brian Reinker holds degrees in Fine Arts and Architectural Design from the University of Cincinnati. He moved to London, completing a year of postgraduate study at the Architectural Association before building a career in architecture and design, working on large-scale office projects, embassies and projects across Eastern Europe. Returning to his first passion, he now works from his studio at Waterloo on London's South Bank. His practice began with painting before turning to paper and collage - a material that offers freedom in colour, geometry, rhythm and repetition, while demanding precision in every cut and layer. His collages gradually left the surface, becoming layered, architectural and sculptural, leading to the Refuge Series, where forms inspired by the landscape explore shelter, protection and retreat. Selected for the Royal Academy Summer Exhibition in 2021, his work is held in collections across the UK, Europe, the Americas, the Far East and Australia.

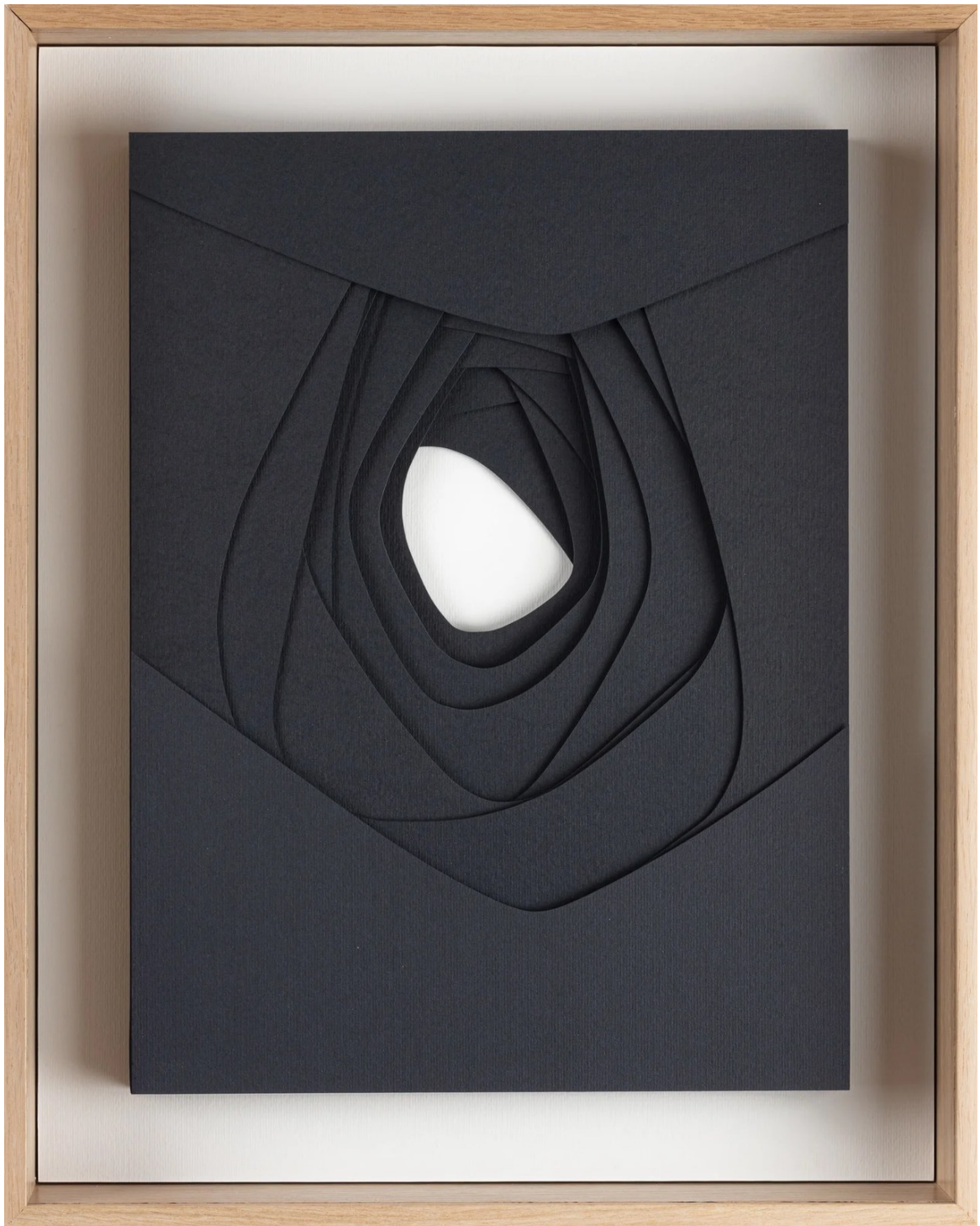

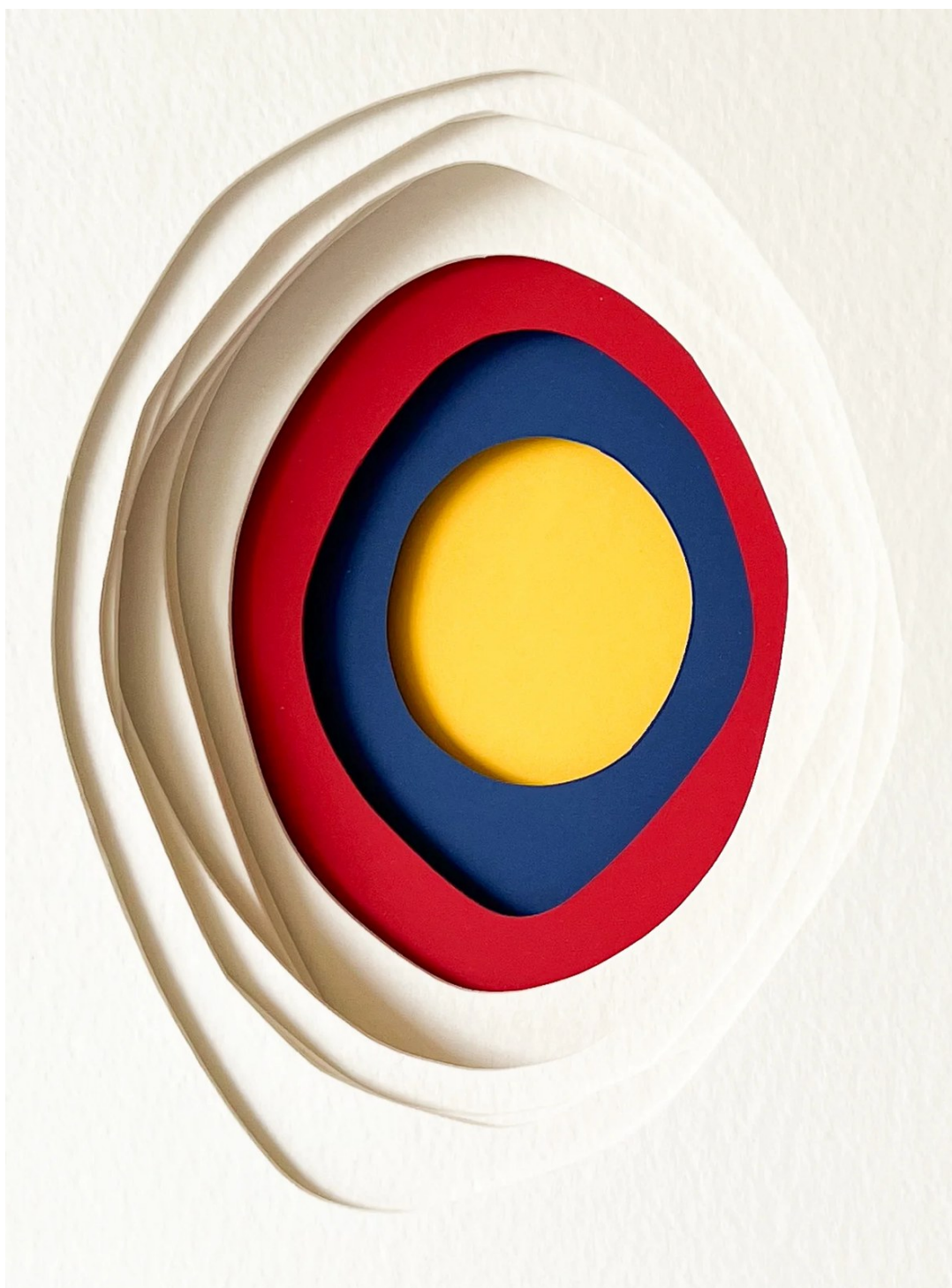

ANNA TORK

American, b. 1990

Anna Tork is an American artist living on Manhattan's Upper West Side by the river, where shifting light, open water and the rhythm of city parks shape her practice. Her paintings explore the balance between translucence and weight: poured washes seep into raw canvas, forming passages of colour that spread and pool, while darker, grounded shapes hold the composition in place. Her process is intentionally slow, each work built gradually, layer by layer - records of time passing: the light across a floor, the quiet of dusk, a moment held in colour.

N A D J A W I L L E M S

Dutch, b. 1971

Nadja Willems is a Dutch photographer working in series, known for her quiet, top-down still lifes of vintage porcelain and domestic rituals. Her images isolate a single vintage cup - porcelain worn smooth by decades of use, hand-painted in Chinese blue, cobalt or faded gold - often accompanied by one biscuit or a sugar cube, shot in soft, even light against pristine white. Each photograph turns an everyday coffee or tea into a quiet meditation on pattern, age and tenderness.
